George Chase, Vermonter, Died June 28 at Home of His Son Fred, In Grant Township.

George Chase, son of Edwin and Sarah Chase, was born at Stanstead, Vermont, June 16, 1857, and died at his home southeast of Grinnell June 28, 1929. He came with his people to Iowa at the age of eleven. They settled on a farm near Malcom. Here he grew to manhood, and later moved to a farm near Jacob where February 1, 1888, he was united in marriage to Estella Berwell, who survives him. To this union five children were born, Fred Chase, Mrs. Fred Anderson, Mrs. C. P. Nister, Josephine, at home, and little Raymond who died in 1908.

Five sisters also mourn his decease, Mrs. Phebe Knapp, Mrs. Lizzie Neville, Mrs. Eliza Legg, Mrs. Cora Pearce and Mrs. Allie Peters of Grinnell.

Mr. Chase was a quiet, lovable man who counted his friends by his acquaintances. His home and his family were his only care. For six years he has been an invalid, having been stricken with paralysis. His devoted wife with her family gave him every care that love could devise.
