Harold L. Christensen, 86, of Indianola, formerly of Malcom, died Monday, Feb. 22, at the Village Nursing Home in Indianola.

Funeral services were conducted at the Clemons United Church of Christ, with burial in Clemons Cemetery.

The son of Albert and Malinda Johnson Christensen, he was born Dec. 11, 1906, in Story City. He received his education in Clemons and was a 1924 graduate of Clemons High School.

He was married to Pearl Davis Feb. 10, 1934, in Nashua. They lived in Stratford where he managed the cooperative elevator for 10 years.

In 1943, they moved to Malcom where he managed the Malcom Co-op Elevator. They moved to Clemons in 1951, and he operated Clemons Grain and Supply until retiring in 1972.

Mr. Christensen was a member of the Clemons Church of Christ, the Farmers Grain Dealers Association of Iowa, the Iowa Warehouseman's Association, the Farmers Service Co. and the Grain Advisory Committee, which he chaired.

Surviving are his wife; one son, Marvin of Clemons; a daughter, Sharon Winchell of Atlantic; four grandsons; four step-grandchildren; three step-great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mildred Arney of Marshalltown.
