**OBITUARY**

Glen E. Cook, eldest son of Will D. and Anna J. Cook, was born at Deep River, Iowa on August 23, 1890, and passed away at the St. Francis Hospital, Grinnell, Iowa on March 22, 1959 at the age of 68 years.

Starting as a photographer in Montezuma, he later became a farmer. In early manhood he became a member of the Methodist Church. On February 21, 1912, he was united in marriage to Floy Scovel of Ames, Iowa. To this union two daughters were born.

They farmed near Tilton for sometime, and in 1939 they moved to their own farm northwest of Montezuma. Due to ill health he retired from the farm about one year ago, and they moved to their present home in Montezuma. Glen was a member of the Masonic Lodge.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, Bruce, and one sister, Orpha Redpath. He is survived by his faithful wife, Floy; two daughters, Evelyn M. Martin of Montezuma, and Helen E. Secor of North English; three grandchildren, Patricia Martin and Norman and James Secor; and one sister, Mrs. Margaret Icenbice of Grinnell; and many good friends and neighbors who have known him through his lifetime.
