

Mrs. Lee Cram Of Brooklyn Dies Here Last Week

Funeral services for Mrs. Lee Cram were held last Friday at 10:00 a.m. at St. Patrick's church in Brooklyn in charge of the Rev. G. A. Lillis, pastor.

Interment was in Calvary cemetery. Pallbearers included four sons, Raymond, LaVaughn, Delmar and Robert, a son-in-law, Ivan Allgood, and a nephew, Joseph Collum, jr.

Mrs. Cram, who would have been 62 years old last Thursday, died Jan. 11 at a hospital in Grinnell where she had been a patient for about two weeks. She had been in poor health for 17 years and was confined to a wheel chair for the past 15 years. Mrs. Cram had suffered a heart attack around Christmas from which she failed to recover.

Mamie Ann Collum, daughter of Hugh and Emma Collum, was born near Holbrook, Jan. 12, 1894, and died Jan. 11 1956. At an early age she moved with her parents to a farm six miles south of Brooklyn she lived many years.

She was married Sept. 16, 1913, to Lee Cram of Brooklyn and six children were born to the couple. They include Mrs. M. J. Wilcox and Robert of Brooklyn; Mrs. Ivan Allgood and LaVaughn of Grinnell; Delmar of Humboldt and Raymond of Sigourney.

In addition to her husband and six children she leaves 15 grand-children; one great-grandchild; six brothers, Ray of Prescott, Ariz.; James of LaFayette, Ind., John of Grinnell, Joseph of Deep River, Dynise of Williamsburg and Leonard of Hollywood, Calif. and four sisters, Margaret of Williamsburg, Mrs. William Nowatny of Victor, Mrs. Michael Moore of Iowa City and Mrs. Don Kent of Chicago, Ill.
