Mrs. Mattie A. Cunningham Passed Away Here Thursday

Mrs. Mattie A. Cunningham died Thursday afternoon in a local hospital at the age of 82 years after suffering several strokes. She had moved to Grinnell three months ago with her sister, Mrs. G. L. Morgan and has been living at 1625 Sixth avenue. The Morgans had been living north of Kellogg.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the James funeral home in charge of Rev. W. F. Overhulser and burial was made in the Newton Union cemetery beside her husband. Pall bearers were Earl Trout, Melvin Mayfield, Berdine Gradwell, Charles Simpson, H. L. Morgan and C. N. James.

Mattie A. Patton Cunningham was born at Buford, Ohio, Oct. 18, 1869, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James E. Patton, and passed away at Grinnell, Feb. 14, 1952, at the age of 82 years, 5 months and 26 days.

At the age of 4 years she moved from Ohio to Iowa. Most of her life was spent in Iowa and Nebraska.

On June 10, 1924, she was married to Arthur H. Cunningham at Kansas City, Mo. They lived at Osage City, Kan., for one year, then moved to Lincoln, Neb., where they resided until August of 1949 when Mrs. Cunningham came to Kellogg to make her home with her sister, Mrs. G. L. Morgan. In November of 1951 she moved with Mr. and Mrs. Morgan to 1625 6th Avenue in Grinnell and passed away at St. Francis hospital. She was preceded in death by her husband, father and mother and five brothers. Survivors are one sister, Mrs. G. L. Morgan, several nephews and nieces and a host of friends.
