Miss Edna Davis, Veteran Teacher in
Schools of Grinnell, Passed Away
Last Night.

**HAD BEEN TEACHER HERE
FOR THIRTY-EIGHT YEARS**

**Her Life Has Been of Incalculable In-
fluence on Lives of Many Grinnell
Young People.**

A life of service, whose accomplish-
ments can be measured in the lives of
the thousands of Grinnell young folks
whom she has taught and in whom
she has implanted ideals of service
and right living, ended when Miss
Edna Davis passed away last night at
12:15 o'clock. A life such as hers is of
untold influence. Miss Edna Davis
and her sister, Miss Lizzie, have been
born teachers and they have spent
their active lives teaching Grinnell
youth. They have earned the respect
and affection of all with whom they
have come in contact during that time.
Miss Edna Davis had taught in the
schools of Grinnell thirty-eight years;
Miss Lizzize has taught even longer.

For the past two or three years Miss
Edna Davis has been in failing health
but it was not until last January that
she ceased her active work in the
schools and went to California on a
trip that it was hoped would restore
her strength. She was no better when
she returned and has steadily grown
worse until the end last night.

Quiet, unassuming, a teacher who
loved her work and loved her pupils,
Edna Davis has left a void in the life
of Grinnell which will not be easily
filled.

The funeral will be held at 7:00
o'clock Sunday evening from the home
at 1427 West street.
