

## Smith Davis Services Held

Smith Davis, 59, of 1111 Washington Ave., died late Monday morning of an apparent heart condition while fox hunting northwest of Malcom.

The son of Fred and Maggie O'Hara Davis, he was born March 16, 1913, near Malcom. He was married to Lena Adele Lincoln at the home of her uncle, the Rev. Robert Lincoln, in Grinnell May 16, 1936. The couple had one daughter, Mrs. James (Mary Leona) Klemm of Kellogg.

Mr. and Mrs. Davis had made their home in Grinnell since their marriage. Prior to the occurrence of his heart condition some years ago, "Smitty" Davis was employed by Gene Tyree Home Builders in Grinnell as a carpenter. He was a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, Aerie No. 2545, of Grinnell.
