## Kellogg Farmer William Deppe Dies Saturday

William E. (Will) Deppe, 75, died suddenly early Saturday morning at his home northeast of Kellogg.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) from St. Paul's Lutheran church in Kellogg with the Rev. Laverne Streich, pastor of St. John's Lutheran church of Grinnell, officiating. Vocal music was provided by Mrs. George Schaumburg, accompanied by Mrs. Earle Trout at the organ.

Flower bearers were Mrs. Walter Burkes and Mrs. Harry Buchmeier. Pallbearers were Harry Buchmeier, Warren Bates, Marvin Cooper, Martin Paulson, Marion White and Louis Lenz. Burial was in Our Silent City cemetery at Kellogg with Smith Funeral Home in charge.

He was the son of Ernest William and Augusta Brune Deppe and was born in Newton on Jan. 9, 1887. He attended the local rural schools near the family farm home and the Baxter schools.

Mr. Deppe lived and farmed in Jasper county all of his life.

He was united in marriage with Wadie Littrell on Jan. 8, 1913, in the Lutheran church at Kellogg. To this union were born three children: Lorne Deppe and Maynard Deppe, both of Kellogg, and Mrs. Merle (Viola) Paulson of Grinnell.

He is survived by his widow, Wadie at the family farm home; three children; six grandchildren; and three brothers, Herman, Henry, and Albert Deppe, all of Kellogg.

Preceding him in death were his parents and one brother and one sister.
