

Frank Donahue 3-8-1932 Passes Away This Afternoon

Francis C. Donahue, who has been in poor health for ten months and seriously ill for several weeks, passed away shortly after 1 o'clock this afternoon at his home, 1415 Main street. Funeral arrangements have not been completed at time of going to press.

Mr. Donahue was born in Ogden, Utah, and came to Grinnell with his parents when a small boy. He has lived here since that time. At the time of the cyclone of 1882 he was a boy on the farm four miles northwest of town where he spent his early manhood. He was a collector for a number of years for the Spaulding Manufacturing Co. and later was with the Bailey-Carney Buggy Co. He was for a time in the buggy business with J. C. Goodrich and H. W. Spaulding. Later he was in the buggy business for himself for several years and for the last twelve years he has been associated with C. H. Hanson in the farm loan business.

He is survived by his wife and one daughter, Betty.

F. C. Donahue Is Buried In 3-11-32 Des Moines

Brief funeral services for Francis Charles Donahue, who passed away Tuesday afternoon after a long illness, were held this afternoon at the chapel in the mausoleum of Glendale cemetery in Des Moines, conducted by Rev. E. M. Vittum. The funeral party left Grinnell shortly after 1 o'clock this afternoon following a brief prayer service at the home.

Mr. Donahue had lived in Grinnell for fifty years. He was sixty years old having been born Jan. 8, 1872, at Middlebury, Vt. He leaves his wife and a daughter, Betty.

Frank Donahue was a man of rare integrity and possessed the qualities which make for fine friendship. He was liked and respected wherever he was known.
