The son of Charles and
Grace Chloe Tyler Douglass,
he was born Nov. 7, 1903, on
the family farm west of Mal-
com. He graduated from Mal-
com High School in 1921 and
Iowa State College in 1925.
He taught in consolidated
schools near Milford and in
the Guthrie Center schools.

He was married to Eunice
Isabelle Stimson June 29,
1929, and the couple came to
the rural Malcom farm in
1930. During World War II,
Mr. Douglass taught agricul-
ture courses in the Brooklyn
and Grinnell schools, then re-
turned to the family farm in
1954.

He was a member of the
Malcom Presbyterian Church,
serving as a church trustee, a
ruling elder for 60 years, clerk
of session, and Sunday school
teacher. He also worked as a
scoutmaster and in Future
Farmers of America. He was a
member of the Farm Bureau
and the National Farmers Or-
ganization.

Mrs. Douglass died in
1960. In 1971, he was mar-
ried to Letha Mae Johnson,
and the couple continued to
live on the farm. Mr. and
Mrs. Douglass came to Grin-
nell in 1977.

He is survived by his wife,
Letha; two daughters, Loraine
F. Clubbs of Winslow, Ariz.,
and Virginia L. Duffy of
Wabash, Ind.; seven stepchil-
dren; six grandchildren; seven
step-grandchildren; one great-
granddaughter; and three step-
great-grandchildren. He was
