**Mattie Ehret Was  
65-Year Member Of  
Methodist Church**

Mattie, daughter of Mary and Enoch King, was born in Clark county, Ohio, Oct. 23, 1883, and died at her home near Deep River July 3, at 79 years of age.

When she was six she moved with her family to Centralia, Mo. There she attended school and later taught for a few terms.

Mar. 1, 1911, she was united in marriage with Curtis Ehret and to this union, two sons were born. Their entire married life was spent on the Ehret homestead. Since Mr. Ehret's death in 1944, she and her son, Harold, have continued to operate the farm.

She has been a member of the Deep River Methodist church since March 1898, was active for 65 consecutive years, and was a faithful worker in the W.S.C.S.

She was a member of the Linger Longer Club and served as secretary of the Gilmore school for more than 35 years.

She is survived by her two sons, Harold and Raymond; two grandsons, Wayne and Marvin, other relatives and many friends.
