

Glenn Eichhorn buried Thursday

Services for a long time attorney and former county official, Glenn Eichhorn, were held at the Steffy Funeral Home Thursday afternoon, April 5, with the Rev. John Darlington officiating. Miss Alice Underwood was the organist at the rites.

Casket bearers were Roy Fleming, Jack Drafaht, Vincent Johnson, Dean Doonan, James Fichhorn and Phillip Eichhorn. Burial was in Ivy Hill Cemetery at Malcom. Mr. Eichhorn, 91, died Tuesday, April 3, at the Montezuma Senior Home.

The son of John and Julia Eichhorn, he was born in Sheridan Township Jan. 31, 1888. The family moved to south of Malcom where he grew up. He contracted polio when he was 7 1/2 years old and walked with the aid of crutches the rest of his life. He graduated from Malcom High School in 1906 and from the University of Iowa law school in 1910. He worked for the Malcom Savings Bank and the Malcom Lumber Yard until he was elected county clerk of Court in 1913. He served in that office for 26 years. He served four years as county attorney before starting a private law practice which he

maintained for 32 years. He was a member of the county Selective Service Board and was chairman for eight of his 20 years as a member of the board of directors of the Montezuma State Bank. He was secretary-treasurer of the building committee when the present Methodist Church was built. He was a member of the Methodist Church and a 50-year member of the Odd Fellows Lodge. He was married to Maude Sanders on Nov. 20, 1960.

Survivors include his wife, Maude; stepson and family, Lyle and Arlene Sanders, and their son and his wife, Larry and Linda Sanders; two great-grandchildren, Loren and Stacy Sanders; a brother, George, of North Hollywood, Calif.; a nephew, Jack Eichhorn, of Nashville, Tenn.; and a niece, Jean Shay, of Burbank, Calif.
