Hattie A. Eichhorn passed away Saturday morning, Jan. 25th, at a local hospital after an illness of 16 months. She had reached the age of 90 years, 7 months, and 1 day. She was the daughter of Philip J. and Susan Maxwell Mintle, and was born June 24, 1867, at Woodhull, Ill. When about four years of age, she came with her family by covered wagon to Iowa, locating in Malcom township. She grew to womanhood, and taught in the rural schools.

On Sept. 1, 1885, in Grinnell, she was united in marriage to Martin Eichhorn. To this union were born six children—Floyd E. Eichhorn of Brooklyn; Louise Eichhorn Lunt, deceased; Garland E. Eichhorn of Colorado Springs, Colo.; Anna Gertrude Eichhorn, deceased; Philip C. Eichhorn, deceased; and Shirley M. Eichhorn of Grinnell. After the death of their mother in 1923, Mr. and Mrs. Eichhorn took the five Lunt children into their home and reared them with loving care.

Mrs. Eichhorn was preceded in death by her husband, Martin, three children, one sister, Nettie Howard; and three brothers, Ernest, Roy and Lester Mintle. Mrs. Susie Gruhn, a sister, and Guy Mintle, a brother, both of Grinnell survive. She is also survived by nine grandchildren, and 14 great grandchildren.

She was an active member of the Methodist church and a life member of the W.S.C.S. She also was a charter member of the Community Hospital Auxiliary. She was very active in her lifetime helping and serving others in many ways. Mrs. Eichhorn will be missed in her family, her church, and her community.

One of Grinnell's oldest and most prominent citizens, Mrs. Hattie Eichhorn, 90, succumbed at her home Saturday following an illness of approximately 16 months.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) at the Methodist church with Dr. G. S. Bruiland, minister of the Methodist church, officiating. Organ music was furnished by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner.

Born June 24, 1867 at Woodhull, Ill., she was the daughter of Philip and Susan Maxwell Mintle. When about three years old, she came to this area with her family by covered wagon and spent the remainder of her life in Malcom and Grant townships.

Mrs. Eichhorn was a life member of the W.S.C.S. of the Methodist church and was also a charter member of the Community hospital auxiliary.

On Sept. 1st, 1885, she was united in marriage with Martin Eichhorn at Grinnell and they became the parents of six children. Her husband preceded her in death in 1951.

Survivors include three sons, Floyd of Brooklyn, Shirley of Grinnell, and Garland of Colorado Springs. Another son, Philip, and two daughters, Anna Eichhorn and Gertrude Lunt
