Grinnell Sacrifices a Bright Young  
Member of the S. A.  
T. C.

FLOYD WAS GRADUATE OF  
THE HIGH SCHOOL IN '17

Burial in Hazelwood Wednesday —  
Rev. N. J. Peterson Officiating  
at the Services.

Floyd Charles Evans, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles T. Evans, was born January 13th, 1899, in Grinnell. Attended Grinnell schools, beginning with the kindergarten department, and graduated from the Grinnell high school June 8th, 1917. Was in the U. S. mail service after graduation until he entered Grinnell S. A. T. C., Sept. 21st 1918.

Was a member of Co. B; also mem-

ber of the College Y. M. C. A. and B. Y. P. U. On Saturday, November 9th, was taken sick with Spanish influenza, which later developed into pneumonia, complicated by heart trouble. Floyd was brought to his home Wednesday, November 20th, and died Monday, the 25th, 1918, aged 19 years, 10 months and 12 days. Leaves parents, two sisters, Mrs. Ward Briggs and Miss Elsie Evans, and one little brother, Donavan, all of Grinnell; a grandmother, Mrs. Tina Berryman of Blue Grass, Ia.; and many other relatives and friends to mourn his loss.

The funeral services were held from the Grinnell Baptist church, conducted by Rev. N. J. Peterson, pastor of the church. An escort of the S. A. T. C. accompanied the remains, with interment in Hazelwood cemetery. The pallbearers were those chosen from among his comrades.

Floyd was an exemplary young man—a member of the Grinnell Baptist church.

The relatives and friends cannot mourn as those who have no hope, for he was a child of God. His work is done, and the victory won. Floyd will be greatly missed in the home circle, and by his many kindred and friends; but his influence for good will ever live on. How truthfully it can be said that the world has been made better by his having lived in it.

**TOTAL NUMBER  
OF DEATHS SIX**

Floyd Evans, Son Of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Evans Passed Away At 1:15 o'clock This Afternoon.

Since the last issue of The Register five more boys of the Grinnell College Student Army Training Corps have died of influenza, developing into pneumonia. On Thursday the death of the first victim, Marcus D. Blatt of What Cheer, was chronicled. Added to the list are the names of Howell Clark Lupton, Ora W. Perkins, Donald McFarland, James Robert Lorenz and Floyd Evans.

**Ora W. Perkins.**

Ora W. Perkins, another S. A. T. C. man of Grinnell College, died on Friday, November 22, of Pneumonia. He was born on March 25, 1898, and had reached the age of only 20 years, 7 months and 27 days. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. S. Perkins of Corydon, both of whom were with him at the time of his death.

The body was taken to Millerton, Iowa, for burial.

**Howell Clark Lupton.**

Howell Clark Lupton, student in Grinnell College, was born in Toledo, Iowa, on May 27, 1899, and died Sunday morning at three o'clock at the city hospital, aged eighteen years, five months and twenty-seven days. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Lupton and was a grandson of Leander Clark, who founded and established the college at Toledo, which bears his name.

**Donald McFarland.**

Another college man, who died at the city hospital early yesterday morning was Donald McFarland, of Winthrop, Iowa, a member of the S. A. T. C., who was born in January, 1900. His father, William A. McFarland, was with his son when he died. The mother is not living.

The body was taken to the home in Winthrop at one o'clock this morning where funeral services will be held.

**James Robert Lorenz**

James Robert Lorenz, was a Bloomfield boy, a sweet singer and highly popular with the whole student body. Death came at 11:30 Saturday evening.

"Bobby", as he was better known, was born July 17, 1899, making him at the time of his death 19 years, 4 months and 6 days of age. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. S. A. Lorenz who were notified of his serious illness and were here when he passed away. The body was taken at 4:40 this morning to the home in Bloomfield for burial.

**Floyd Evans.**

Floyd Evans died at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Evans, south of Grinnell, at 1:15 this afternoon. He was a member of the Grinnell College S. A. T. C. and was taken from the barracks by his parents on last Wednesday. He had been sick for something like a week before he was taken home. His death was due to pneumonia developing from influenza.
