Douglas J. Faircloth, 23, of Newton, formerly of Grinnell, died Friday, Dec. 21, in an automobile accident north of Mingo.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Newton, with the Rev. E. William Kaska officiating. Burial was in Our Silent City Cemetery, Kellogg, with the Wallace-Pence Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
