Former Kellogg 1937 Resident Dies

Kellogg, Ia., August 9, Special:

Mrs. S. D. Farnham, a former resident of this vicinity, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. E. Ohler, in Valley Junction early Saturday morning following a two years' illness. Funeral services were held at the Ohler home in Valley Junction Monday morning at 10:00 o'clock, and at the Morgan funeral home in Newton in the afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Burial was made in the Newton Union cemetery.

Rosa Shill was born June 19, 1858, on a farm four and one-half miles northeast of Kellogg. She was united in marriage to Samuel Dyer Farnham Sept. 30, 1879, and they made their home on a farm near here for several years, then moved to Newton where they lived until Mr. Farnham's death about nine years ago. Since that time she has made her home with her daughter at Valley Junction.

The surviving relatives include two daughters, Mrs. C. E. Ohler of Valley Junction and Mrs. P. H. Allen of Rock Island, Illinois; a son, E. A. Farnham, of Kansas City, and two granddaughters, Phyllis Farnham of Kansas City and Mrs. Charles Correll of Chicago, wife of Andy of the Amos and Andy radio team; also two half-brothers, John and W.
