

Conduct Last Rites For Merle Fiser, 44

Funeral services for Merle L. Fiser, 44, were held May 25 at 2:00 p.m. at the Mc Aninch Chapel in Victor with the Rev. John Rosenberger of the Ladora Methodist church officiating. Mrs. Edith Shaul was organist.

Burial was in the I.O.O.F. cemetery at Brooklyn where military rites were accorded by the Victor American Legion Post. Nephews serving as pallbearers were Denny Fiser, Richard Hansen, Dean Fiser, Jim Fiser, David Fiser and Laird Van Renterghem.

The son of Floyd and Wilma Benton Fiser, he was born Sept. 8, 1921, near Victor and died May 23, 1966, at Veterans' hospital in Iowa City where he had been hospitalized intermittently for the last few years.
