Requiem Mass Saturday For F. Fitzpatrick

Frank Fitzpatrick, 85, of 322 Reed St., died Thursday afternoon at a local hospital. He had been in failing health the past several years.

Requiem low mass was held at 8 a.m. Saturday at St. Mary's Catholic church with the pastor, the Rev. L. V. Kuebrich, officiating. The Rosary was recited Friday night at Smith Funeral Home.

Pallbearers at the services were Lester Adkins, Ed McNally, Everett Paw, John Hotchkin, Joe Hotchkin, and Don Donohoe. Burial was at Spirit Lake.

He was the son of Peter and Catherine Joice Fitzpatrick and was born Aug. 1st, 1878, at Grundy Center. His family later moved to Spirit Lake.

On June 10th, 1925, he was united in marriage with Sophia Oberst at Jackson, Minn.

Mr. and Mrs. Fitzpatrick lived in Newton for a time and in 1931 moved to Grinnell. He was employed by the Meadow Gold creamery here as office manager.

A member of the Modern Woodmen of America, he served several years as camp secretary. He was also a member of St. Mary's Catholic church. Survivors include his wife, Sophia, at the family home; his daughter, Mrs. Ned (Mary) Parker of Milwaukee, Wis.; two granddaughters; and a sister, Mrs. Mary Miller of Estherville.
