

**CHARLES C. FORD.**

Funeral services for Charles C. Ford, well known and respected citizen of this city, who died at his home at 1533 Reed street, Sunday, January 1, were conducted from the home Tuesday afternoon by Rev. W. C. Wasser, of the Methodist church. Mrs. E. A. Black and Mrs. A. S. Ennis sang, and H. P. Simmon, Peter Madill, Frank Clindinin, Sam Downey, J. N. Hartzell and Chester Hummell acted as pall bearers. A profusion of floral offerings and the number of friends attending gave evidence of the high regard which many friends had for Mr. Ford.

Charles C. Ford was born in Cedar county, Iowa, August 1, 1868, and passed away January 1, 1922, at the age of 53 years and five months.

When a small boy he moved with his parents to Jasper county where he attended country school, and later moved with his parents near to Grinnell where he finished his education, attending high school in Grinnell.

He was married Feb. 21, 1895, to Miss Ollie Fawcett of Grinnell. After his marriage he made his home on a farm near town with the exception of one year in Missouri.

Three years ago this coming March he moved to his present home.

Last summer he was stricken with rheumatism and Bright's disease which caused his death.

He leaves his wife, a mother, Mrs. A. Ford, two sisters, Mrs. O. Jackson and Mrs. Mehlin, one brother, Guy Ford of Jamesport, Mo., besides a host of friends.

Mr. Ford was one of nature's real gentlemen, always kind, courteous and reliable. His death is a real loss and he will always be held in loving memory.
