Harriet Gale dies in Florida

Harriet M. Gale, 72, of 502 Tenth Ave., Grinnell, died early Monday morning at Mercy Hospital in Orlando, Fla. *Nov. 7*

Memorial services for Mrs. Gale will be held at 2:30 p.m. Monday at the Grinnell United Church of Christ—Congregational, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad officiating. Mrs. Gale was a member of the United Church of Christ—Congregational, and was active in many lay activities in the church. She was a charter member of Chapter JB of PEO, a member of the Levart Club, and a past member of the Uncle Sam's Club board. She was also active in the League of Women Voters.

Mr. and Mrs. Gale had been spending their winters in Florida in recent years and had just arrived at their home there when Mrs. Gale died.
