The oldest child of W. F. and Nora Barnard Lake, Edna Lake Garrett was born Jan. 2, 1885 at Anamosa. In 1897 the family moved to Arlington, Iowa, where she assisted her father in the newspaper office. She was baptized into the Christian Church at Arling-

ton. In 1912 the family bought the What Cheer Patriot and moved to What Cheer.

In 1927 the Garretts moved to Deep River and bought the Deep River Record. They operated the newspaper for 30 years until their health began to fail.

Edna Garrett, Former Publisher, Dies at Age 82
