

Sister Stanislaus rites held

Sister Stanislaus G. Goetz, O.S.F., 77, former administrator of St. Francis Hospital here, died Monday, Jan. 4, at The Alverno retirement home in Clinton where she had resided since 1936.

The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at 2 p.m. Thursday at Mount St. Clare Chapel in Clinton, with the Rev. Raymond Ruppenkamp officiating. Pallbearers were Sisters of St. Francis, nieces and nephews. Burial was in St. Ireneaus Catholic Cemetery, Clinton.

The daughter of Frank and Amanda Peterson Goetz, she was born on Jan. 19, 1910, in Cedar Rapids. She entered the Order of St. Francis in September 1928, professing her vows in June 1931.

She received her B.S.N. degree from St. Theresa's Col-

lege, Winona, Minn., in 1938 and earned a master's degree in nursing from Catholic university in Washington, D.C., in June 1956.

She worked at Mercy Hospital in Burlington and St. Francis Hospital in Macomb, Ill. After serving as administrator of the Grinnell hospital and at Grinnell General Hospital when St. Francis and Community hospitals merged, she moved to Clinton, working at The Alverno until her retirement in 1984.

Sister Stanislaus is survived by three sisters, Ruth Pecinovsky of Walker, Iowa, Vincen-talia Chihak of Elma, Iowa, and Rose Trujillo of San Diego, Calif.

She was preceded in death by a sister and three brothers.
