DIES SUDDENLY

Passed Away Monday Evening While
Talking With W. R.
Mullins.

**BODY WILL BE TAKEN
TO PASADENA FOR BURIAL**

**Mr. Gove Is Survived by His Wife
And Daughter Lily In Cali-
fornia.**

Harry Gove, honored and respected in Grinnell for many years, died very suddenly about 7:20 o'clock Monday evening, while in the yard of his home on High street, talking with W. R. Mullins who rented the place from him.

Mr. Gove made his home in Grinnell for many years, but a few years ago moved to California with his wife and daughter Lily and they have been making their home in Pasadena. However, Mr. Gove made frequent visits in Grinnell to look after his property interests and his visits have always been anxiously looked forward to by his friends.

A few weeks ago he returned on one of his frequent visits and as his custom was occupying a room in his own home.

Monday evening Mr. Mullins was out washing his car when Mr. Gove came out and joined him, and they talked together, Mr. Gove telling of some work he had been doing that afternoon on one of his farms, which he had recently acquired. Suddenly he stopped speaking and Mr. Mullins saw his hand clutch the fender of the car as though to hold himself up. Then he sank to the ground. Death is thought to have been instantaneous. Mr. Mullins summoned help at once, but there was nothing that could be done.

Acting on directions from Mrs. Gove and Lily, the body will be shipped this evening to Pasadena, where funeral services will be held.

Mr. Gove had large property interests in this vicinity, owning a number of farms. He was a likeable, friendly, honorable man, and his sudden death has brought sorrow to a wide circle of friends.

It is thought that his death was due to heart failure as brothers of his had died in a similar manner.
