Tracy Gove

H. M. Gove received a telegram yesterday morning from Long Beach, California, announcing the sudden death at three o'clock yesterday morning, of his brother Tracy, who with his family has been spending the winter there, having driven there in his car last October. Mr. Gove had not been well, but a letter received Wednesday evening said that he was doing nicely and might be expected to improve.

The family will remain in California for the balance of the winter and H. M. Gove will join them there soon after March 1. The body will be brought back for interment in the spring.

Mr. Gove had lived within sight of Grinnell ever since 1864, having come to this vicinity when four years old. He has lived in Grinnell the past 12 years. During the past five or six years he has devoted his attention to managing the 400 acre farm which he owned near Sully and to the 520-acre tract owned by W. F. Vogt near Turner, where he and Mr. Vogt were in partnership in the stock business.

He was 57 years old. He is survived by his wife, two sons, Sabin and Ray, and three daughters, Mrs. Carrie James, of Douglass, Wyo.; Sadie, of Long Beach, and Mrs. Lulu Mitchell, of Dayton, Ohio, and two brothers, H. M. Gove, of this city, and Sheriff W. S. Gove, of Newton.
