Mark Graham dies in crash

Mark J. Graham, 21, of Rte. 1, Malcom, was killed Friday, May 22, when the vehicle he was driving collided with a truck north of Malcom on U.S. Highway 53.

Funeral services were conducted at 11 a.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Brooklyn, with the Rev. Karl Holtkamp officiating. Pallbearers were Ken Kriegel, Lawrence McNaul, Todd Van Wyk, Lynn Chedester, LeRoy Kline and Gregory Reedy. Burial was in Haven Cemetery, rural Tama.

The son of Timothy Allan and Pauline Ann Cline Graham, he was born on April 2, 1966, in Grinnell. He graduated from BGM High School in 1985 where he had participated in wrestling and drama.

He had been employed by the 63-30 Oil Co. at Malcom. He was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Brooklyn.
