

Mabel Wallace Gwinn's Funeral Held Thursday

Funeral services for Mabel Wallace Gwinn, daughter of Tony Wallace, formerly of Grinnell, whose death in the hospital in Iowa City was announced in Tuesday's Herald, were held Thursday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the Friends church conducted by Rev. Robert Lincoln. A quartet composed of Dr. Curtis Green, Huff, Donald Schooley and Joe Haupt sang "Going Down the Valley" and "Jesus, Lover of My Soul." Pallbearers were Clarence Doud, Mahlon Doud, Albert Lincoln, Don Sparks, Lloyd Sisco, and Kenneth Shockley.

Mabel Margaret Wallace Gwinn was born to Mary Jane and Tony Wallace May 7, 1914. She attended Grinnell public school. On October 20, 1928, she was united in marriage to William Draper. To this union one son was born. The most of her life has been spent in this city.

The last two years she has been in Mt. View, Calif., but came to Grinnell about three months ago to be with her brother, Wilburn, during his illness. It was during this time she was overcome by this sickness and was taken to the hospital at Iowa City, and passed away Sept. 16, 1934, at the age of 20 years, four months and nine days.

She leaves to mourn her passing one son, Robert, her father, Tony Wallace of Side Lake, Minn., one sister, Mrs. W. G. Pederson of Villisca, Ia., three brothers, Wilburn of this city, Everett of Villisca, Ia., and Russell of Davenport, and two grandmothers of whom she was very fond, Mrs. Elizabeth Doud of Grinnell and Mrs. Leary of Tainter.

Her mother preceded her in death about a year ago. In her last suffering which she bore bravely, she spoke of wanting to be with her mother in the other world.
