

Mrs. Andrew Haag Died Saturday

Funeral Services for Long Time
Resident Held Monday; Burial
in Deep River Cemetery

A long and blameless life, devoted faithfully and unassumingly during many years to the welfare and comfort of husband and children, reached a peaceful close Saturday morning when Mrs. Andrew Haag passed away at her home on Park street. She had passed her 81st birthday on June 6, and until comparatively recently had been able to be busy with her customary tasks about the home.

Mrs. Haag was born in Germany June 6, 1854, the daughter of Adam and Anna Gabriel. She came to this country when she was two years old. She was married to Andrew Haag in Iowa county on March 2, 1873. Mr. Haag preceded her in death several years ago.

To this union were born nine children, one of whom, Elizabeth, died in infancy. She is survived by eight children, Miss Emline, Williams, Mrs. Clint Cranston, Mrs. George Elliot and Mrs. Neils Keller, all of Deep River, and Katherine, Pearl and Orrie of Grinnell; eleven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; a niece, Mrs. Emma McBlain of Grinnell; two brothers, James and Kirkwood Gabriel of Deep River, and one sister, Mrs. Mary Biedeback of Pasadena, Calif.

Largely attended funeral services were held from the Haag home at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Charles R. Rowe, pastor of the Methodist church, assisted by Professor J. D. Stoops, next door neighbor and a long time friend. The casket was heaped with a profusion of beautiful flowers, the last tribute of many sorrowing friends. As the company assembled, the music of old time hymns was heard softly through an amplifying system. After the reading of the Scripture by Rev. Mr. Rowe, Professor Stoops offered a prayer marked by eloquence and deep feeling. Rev. Mr. Rowe then offered a short but appropriate talk on the subject, "The Comforting God." Burial was in the Golden Rod cemetery in Deep River.
