### Services Held

George F. Hagen, 91, a resident of Grinnell the past 58 years, died Saturday evening (Dec. 22) at Friendship Manor, following an extended illness.

The son of John and Elizabeth Hagen, he was born Aug. 11, 1882, in Bavaria. He came to the United States with his parents when he was four, and they settled in Indiana before moving to New Boston, Iowa. He received his education in the public schools of that community.

After completing his education, he moved to Illinois and, on June 26, 1913, was married to Lillie Malmrose at Rock Island, Ill. In 1914 they moved to Grinnell, and Mr. Hagen established and operated a garage until his retirement in 1943.

He was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational and was a 50-year member of the Oddfellows Lodge.

Mr. Hagen is survived by his three children, Arnold of Grinnell, Mrs. Keith (Violet) Ryan of West Des Moines, and Mrs. Gene (Bonnie) Schmidt of Cedar Rapids; and four grandchildren, Barbara Hagen, Mark and Jennifer Schmidt, and Timothy Ryan. He

was preceded in death by his parents; his wife Lillie in 1967; a son, Irvin; five brothers, Frank, Chris, Phillip, William and Charles; and two sisters, Clara and Elizabeth.

Funeral services for Mr. Hagen were held at 1 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 26, at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home, with the Rev. Newell E. Davis officiating. Organist was Kathleen Heffner, and pallbearers were Lyman Case, Merton Johnson, Karl Eker, Francis Keenan, Frank Fowler, and John Hotchkin. Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery.
