

Willard Hagen memorial set

Willard E. Hagen, 67, of 916 Eighth Ave., Grinnell, died Tuesday evening, Sept. 17, at St. Francis Manor, following a lengthy illness.

A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. Friday at the United Church of Christ-Congregational, Fourth Ave. and Broad St., with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad officiating. Deanne Acrea will be the organist.

Survivors include his wife, Gene of Grinnell; a daughter, Sharon of Lawrence, Kan.; one brother, Gerald of Grinnell; and two sisters, Lorraine Carlisle of Stockton, Calif., and Marguerite Slavin of Muncie, Ind. He was preceded in death by his parents.
