

Rites For Glenn Hall Conducted Saturday

Funeral services for Glenn Hall, 66, Madison township farmer, were held Saturday afternoon at two o'clock at the Madison Church of Christ in charge of Robert W. Seath, minister. Mrs. Henry Hendrickson was organist.

Glenn Thomas Hall, son of William C. and Janet Russell Lang Hall, was born Oct. 4, 1895, in Madison township where he had lived most of his life. He died May 10, 1962, at University hospitals in Iowa City following an illness of several months.

On August 30, 1922, he was married to Madeline Speeter at St. Charles, Minn. Five

children were born to the couple. They are Mrs. Ross (Miriam) Mitchell of Malcom, Norman R. Hall of Grinnell, Donald H. Hall of Montezuma, Mrs. Marvin (Carol) Klein of Barnes City and John W. Hall, at home.

Mr. Hall was a member of the Madison Church of Christ where he had served as deacon, treasurer, trustee and financial secretary. At the time of his death he was secretary of the official board of the church. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen of America and a charter member of the Poweshiek County Farm Bureau.

In addition to his wife and children he leaves one brother, Harrison Hall of Brooklyn and three sisters, Mrs. Jesse Miller, Mrs. Glen Read and Mrs. Hazel Clayton, all of Brooklyn. He also leaves 14 grandchildren.

Glenn Thomas Hall, son of William C. and Janet Russell Lang Hall, was born Oct. 4, 1895 in Madison township, where he spent most of his life. He passed from this life at the University hospital in Iowa City May 10, being 66 years, 7 months and 6 days of age.

He was united in marriage to Madeline Speeter, Aug. 1922 at St. Charles, Minn. To this union 5 children were born: Miriam (Mrs. Ross Mitchell), Malcom; Norman R. Hall, Grinnell; Donald H. Hall, Montezuma; Carol (Mrs. Marvin Klein) Barnes City, and John W. Hall at home.

Besides his wife and children, he is survived by a brother, Harrison Hall, Brooklyn; 3 sisters, Mrs. Jesse Miller, Mrs. Glen Read and Mrs. Hazel Clayton, all of Brooklyn. Also 14 grandchildren, a number of nieces and nephews and a great host of friends.

Glenn was a member of the Madison Church of Christ, having been baptized Sept. 15, 1907 by Brother S. J. Epler. He served as a deacon, treasurer, trustee, financial secretary and at the time of his death was secretary to the official board of the church.
