Maurice Franklin Halterman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Halterman, was born in Grinnell, Iowa, September 17, 1909. He had spent all of his life, with the exception of two years, in the community of his birth.

Maurice attended the public schools, graduated from Grinnell high school, and served in the Armed Forces of his country. Since his military service, he had been secretary for Soldiers Relief in Poweshiek County, with offices here in Grinnell.

During his service for his country, he served in the European area, and was discharged as a Staff Sergeant. During his life he was interested in serving others, taking special interest in children and in the families of veterans who were in any kind of need, medical or physical. His direction of some charities will be missed by many. He was a member of the American Legion, the 40 et 8 and Ceremonial Honor Guard, and the Knights of Pythias.

He has suffered some ill health for several years, and recently had some medical checks made in Iowa City. He became seriously ill last week, and passed away April 26, 1958, at a local hospital, past 48 years of age. He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers, Paul, Willard, and Austin, and two sisters, Mary and Nell.

Maurice Halterman is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Lola Rohrick, Inglewood, Calif., and Mrs. Marvel DeJong, New Sharon, Ia.; three brothers, Charles of Newton, Marion of Grinnell, and Ray of Philadelphia, Pa., nieces and nephews, and friends.
