

Mrs. Alice Hammer Of Kellogg Dies In Hospital Here

Mrs. Alice Hammer of Kellogg, widow of F. T. Hammer, died Thursday morning in a local hospital after a critical illness as a result of a stroke. She was 84 years old. Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the Kellogg Methodist church in charge of Rev. Grace Anderson. Burial was in Our Silent City cemetery in Kellogg.

Mrs. Hammer is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Myrtle Coon and Mrs. Katherine Woodward, both of Kellogg, and several nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband who died in 1951.

Active in church work, she was a member of the Kellogg Methodist church, the Woman's Society of Christian Service of the Methodist church and the Order of Eastern Star.

The daughter of William and Mary Parson, she was born July 6, 1869 at Elrod, Ind. At the age of 17 she moved, with her parents, to Kellogg and resided in that Jasper county community since that time.
