

—Charlie D. Hanna was born May 1, 1868, at Helena, Tama Co., Ia. In the fall of 1882 he moved with his parents to Plainview, Pierce Co., Neb. He learned the tonsorial business in Fremont, Neb., and came to Grinnell in 1893 and has been in the employ of Ben Bateham most of the time until last June when he was compelled to give up his work on account of his failing health, nervous prostration, which has gradually grown worse since that time until Tuesday of last week when the disease took a more serious form of congestion of the brain and later on, pneumonia of the lungs which terminated in his death Monday morning Feb. 19, 1900. He was married to Emma Carpenter of this place Feb. 21, 1895, who with her two little boys are left to mourn the loss of a loving husband and kind father. Prompted by his love for his family and his anxiety to provide comforts for them, he worked beyond his strength. The services were conducted by the Rev. W. P. Stoddard of the M. E. Church.
