

## William Harbit

Dr. William G. Harbit, 84, a retired Gilman and Marshalltown chiropractor, died Friday, Feb. 10, in St. Petersburg, Fla.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at First United Methodist Church in Marshalltown, with burial in Rose Hill Memorial Gardens there.

The son of Frank and Grace Peters Harbit, he was born Feb. 6, 1911, in West Branch. He was a graduate of Palmer College of Chiropractic in Davenport and practiced for 43 years.

He was married to Edythe Harvey Aug. 9, 1931. They lived in Gilman and Marshalltown before retiring to Florida in 1988.
