Edith Rae Harness, 58, of Scottsdale, Ariz., formerly of Grinnell, died Monday, Nov. 12, at her home.

A memorial service was held at the Shadow Mountain Mortuary Wednesday evening. The funeral service was conducted at 3 p.m. Friday at Forest Lawn-Cypress California.

The daughter of Glen V. and Flonnie Cooper Bell, she was born Dec. 18, 1925, in Monroe County, Iowa. When she was four, she moved with her family to Grinnell and attended public schools here.
