

Lucille J. Height, 101 (G. ADAM)

Lucille Jordan Height, who was 101-years, two months and nine days-old, died March 9, 1998 at the Montezuma Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

The Rev. John Darlington of Montezuma officiated at the funeral March 12 at the United Methodist Church in Montezuma.

Mrs. Rachele Johnson sang "Lord, I'm Coming Home" and "Amazing Grace," accompanied by Miss Alice Underwood on the organ.

She attended rural school and graduated from Montezuma High School in 1915. She taught briefly in rural schools,

then joined the staff of a local dry goods store, where she worked for William F. Jungck for 21 years.

On May 19, 1918, she married G. Adam Height. They lived a year in Des Moines before returning to Montezuma.

Lucille was a member of the United Methodist Church, the United Methodist Women, the Dorcas Class, the Daughters of the American Revolution and the American Legion Auxiliary.

She taught Sunday School from 1939 to 1975. She also held many offices in both the church and UMW.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband in 1967 and three brothers, Earl William, Allen Edwin and Harry Arthur.

Lucille is survived by nieces and nephews and many great-nieces and nephews, a step-daughter, Marna Shinn of Cedar Rapids and two step-grandchildren, Phillip and Sara Shinn as well as many dear and special friends.
