

# MRS. JOHN HEISHMAN'S FUNERAL HELD TODAY

Anna Mary Miller, the youngest daughter of Catherine and S. S. Miller was born September 22, 1878, near Brooklyn, Iowa, and passed away Sunday, January 31, 1926, at her home in Grinnell, after an illness lasting several months.

She lived with her parents near Brooklyn until she was married on June 7, 1896, to John L. Heishman, when she moved to a farm near Malcom. In 1910 they moved to Grinnell where they have since resided.

To this marriage three children were born, one a daughter, Vera Louise, who died at the age of eighteen months and two sons, Truman C. and Grant M. Heishman.

Besides her husband and two sons she is survived by two grandchildren Phyllis and Jimmy, three sisters, Mrs. Laura Renner of Ames, Mrs. Dora Heatwole of Brooklyn and Mrs. Minnie Brunk of Des Moines, also three brothers, Frank Miller of Brooklyn, John and Jake Miller of Belle Plaine.

On January 23, 1926, Mrs. Heishman was baptized into the Methodist church by Rev. George Blagg, pastor.

During her long illness her devoted husband gave her his most loving care and helped and comforted and cheered her in every possible way.

The sons' wives, Florence and Marie, bear testimony to the loving care of the deceased woman who was a vertiable mother to her daughters-in-

Mrs. Heishman's whole life was marked by a patient, uncomplaining character, and a generous hearted helpfulness at all times to all who came in contact with her.

The funeral services today were in charge of Rev. George Blagg. Prayer was offered at the home on East street and at 2 o'clock there were services in the Methodist church at Malcom. Music was furnished by a male quartet from the college, who sang "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere," "Jesus, Savior, Pilot Me" and "Perfect Day." The pall bearers were the three brothers, Frank, John and Jake Miller and three brothers in law, Gus, Ernest and Will Heishman. Burial was in the Malcom cemetery.
