

Good Woman Answers Call

Mrs. Ernest Heishman Passes
Away at Her Home in Sheridan Township.

The cycle of death again came and took its toll from Sheridan when Mrs. Ernest Heishman, calm, sweet and peaceful, just as her entire life was lived, fell asleep on Friday. She had been in failing health for the past eight years and for the last five months was confined to her bed. All that medical science and skill and tender care and nursing could do was done for her.

Sallie A. Heishman was the daughter of John M. and Katherine Miller and was born at Brooklyn, Iowa, on Feb. 28, 1882, and died in Sheridan township Iowa, on December 22, 1933, having reached the age of 51 years, 9 months and 24 days.

In 1893 she moved to Sheridan where she spent the remainder of her life. On Feb. 23, 1902, she was united in marriage with Ernest Heishman. They have farmed since in Sheridan.

A woman of cheerful disposition and many accomplishments and outstanding qualities of character. Mrs. Heishman held a position of high esteem in her community. It is because of the loyalty and untiring energy of women such as Mrs. Heishman that the Sheridan Ladies' Aid Society is the fine organization that it is and it is because of the same reason that the community of Sheridan has so long been an outstanding farming community in Iowa. Mrs. Heishman was one of the hardest workers in the Sheridan Ladies' Aid. She also was a member of the Rebekah lodge of Malcom.

Mrs. Heishman is survived by her husband, Ernest Heishman, her mother, Mrs. Kate Heishman; three sisters, Mrs. Gus Heishman and Mrs. Andrew Shadel of Brooklyn and Mrs. Wm. Heishman of Sheridan; three half-brothers, Clifford, Lester and Elza Heishman, all of Sheridan, and a number of nieces and nephews and a large number of relatives. One brother, Benjamin, died in childhood.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Sheridan church, Rev. W. S. Kight of Des Moines, formerly pastor of the Sheridan church officiating. The Rebekahs of Malcom had charge of the services at the grave.

The casketbearers were six brothers of the deceased, Will, Gus, John, Clifford, Lester and Elza Heishman.
