

**Last Services For  
Jens Hendrickson  
Were Held Friday**

Funeral services for Jens Hendrickson, who died Wednesday at the ripe age of 86 years, were held at the Smith funeral home Friday afternoon in charge of Rev. C. F. Polson and Rev. Isaac Johnson. Music was provided by Miss Hazel Keller, Mrs. Robert Reimers and Mrs. Glen Read. Casketbearers were Elwood Burlingame, Marion Hendrickson, Harold Keller, William Kuntz, Larry Lang and Maynard Lang. Interment was in the Haven cemetery southeast of Tama.

Jens Hendrickson passed quietly into the presence of his Lord from his home at 1027 Summer street in Grinnell, Ia., at 3:15 p. m., December 13, 1950, at the age of 86 years, five months, and fifteen days. Mr. Hendrickson had been in failing health for the past few years and was confined to his home almost a year.

Jens Hendrickson, the eldest son of Rokel and Henrik Jensen was born June 28, 1864, near Stavanger, Norway. He came to America in October, 1882. With the exception of four years residence in Minnesota, Mr. Hendrickson lived and farmed in
