Melissa Kay Henning, 15, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Henning of Rte. 2, Grinnell, died Sunday evening at University Hospitals in Iowa City, where she had been a patient the past 11 days following a fall on the ice while on a school trip to Cedar Falls.

She was born in Grinnell Nov. 6, 1957. She attended Fairview, Cooper, and Davis elementary schools in Grinnell and was a member of the ninth grade class at Grinnell Junior High School. She had been a member of the Camp Fire Girls, and while in junior high was a member of the seventh and eighth grade choirs and the ninth grade band in which she played the trumpet.

Survivors include her parents; her sister, Jane Anne, 10; her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Henning of Kellogg and Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Matteson of Grinnell; her paternal great-grandmother, Mrs. Lula Reynolds of Newton; and several aunts, uncles and cousins.
