

Mrs. Horn dies

Arlene Edgington Horn, 84, widow of Reuben E. Horn, died Monday, May 19, at Friendship Manor.

Funeral services were held Thursday morning at Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Raymond C. Lott officiating. Organist was Kathleen Heffner and vocal music was by Gordon Van Donselaar. Pallbearers were Michael Edgington, Roger Edgington, Ronald Edgington, Charles Fritz, Jerry Kelly and Stephen Reams. Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery. She was the daughter of George Christopher and Dora Read Edgington and was born southeast of Grinnell Dec. 8, 1901. She attended rural schools and graduated from Grinnell High School in 1921. She later received her degree

in education from Iowa State Teachers College, Cedar Falls, and taught in rural schools in Jasper County, later teaching mathematics and algebra in schools in Lynnville-Sully, North Mahaska, Grinnell and Pendleton, Ore.

On Aug. 21, 1954, she was married to Reuben E. Horn at the Little Brown Church in Nashua. The couple lived on a wheat ranch near Pendleton, then returned to make their home in Grinnell in 1967. She was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church; Grinnell chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution; Delta Kappa Gamma and several teachers' organizations.

Survivors include two brothers Harold and Loren Edgington and a sister Mildred Edgington, all of Grinnell, and three nieces and two nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband.
