

Forrest Horsford Rites Held Sunday

Mr. Horsford, 75, passed away at the Iowa City Veteran's Hospital on Friday, June 27.

The son of Josephine and Clark Horsford, he was born in Chicago, Ill., on Sept. 28, 1893. While a youth the family moved to California where his mother died when he was 14 years-of-age. Shortly after, he came to Montezuma to live with his sister - the Dr. A. B. Graham family. He graduated from Montezu-

ma High School in 1913.

He was a sergeant, serving as a pharmacist in the Medical Corps during World War I, stationed in Siberia and in the Philippine Islands.

In January of 1921, he was united in marriage with Clara

Johnston and to this union two children were born.

For several years he was Deputy County Clerk and later served as a postal clerk until his retirement.

He was a 50-year member of Lafayette Lodge No. 52,

AF & AM, and of Blakley-Stevens Post of the American Legion. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church choir.

He is survived by his wife; their son, Howard of Rochester, N. Y.; their daughter, Mrs. Genevieve Thompson and three grandchildren, of Iowa City.
