Darrell Hubbard Dies In Arizona; Wife Listed Fair

Darrell Hubbard, 62, a Brooklyn resident, died Friday, March 13, east of Winslow, Ariz., on his way back to Iowa from San Diego, Calif.

An autopsy performed on the body showed Mr. Hubbard died of a massive coronary occlusion while driving on U.S. Highway 66. He had pulled out to pass a truck on the highway when he slipped over the steering wheel of the car. Mrs. Hubbard grabbed the wheel and she was sent out of control, striking a rock bank and rolling over 2 1/2 times.

Mrs. Hubbard was taken to a Winslow hospital where she is listed in fair condition.

The Hubbards had spent the winter in San Diego, Calif., with their son, Ronald Hubbard, and family. They had been called home to Iowa where Mr. Hubbard's mother is in poor health.

Mr. and Mrs. Hubbard lived at 414 Broadway in Brooklyn where Mr. Hubbard had recently sold his business, the Hubbard Lumber Co. Mr. Hubbard's body is being returned to Brooklyn by train and will arrive in Des Moines Tuesday afternoon. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Thursday at the Brooklyn Methodist Church.

Burial will be on Friday at Whiting, Iowa.
