O.C. Huff memorial set

The Rev. O.C. Huff, 92, of the Mayflower Home died Tuesday, Jan. 28, at Grinnell General Hospital.

A memorial service will be conducted at 3 p.m. Monday in Denison Chapel of the Mayflower Home, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad of the United Church of Christ-Congregational officiating. Mr. Huff's body was donated to the College of Osteopathic Medicine in Des Moines.

The son of Alva and Gertrude Green Huff, he was born on May 17, 1893, at Beaver City, Neb. His childhood was spent in western Kansas and eastern Colorado. He was a graduate of Simpson College.

He was ordained on March 24, 1918, at the Afton Christian Church. He spent over 50 years in the ministry before moving to the Mayflower Home in October 1969. Mr. Huff served in churches at Clemon, Panora, Beaver, Exira, Oakland, Montour and Danville. He also served rural churches in the counties of Taylor, Adams, Guthrie, Dallas, Union and Madison.

He was active in welfare work and was listed in "Who's Who in Iowa." In 1946, the Des Moines Register and Tribune conducted a statewide poll of the best-liked person, and Mr. Huff received the honor. He was a 50-year member of the Masonic Lodge.

Survivors include his children, Horace of Ankeny, Vera Schach of Portland, Ore., and Lowell of Evergreen, Colo.; 9 grandchildren; and 9 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, Eulah; his parents; one brother, Otto; and a sister, Grace Huff.
