

## Rites held for Jon Hulin

Jon C. Hulin, 43, of Gilman died Wednesday at an abandoned farmhouse near Gilman. Rufus Kruse, M.D., deputy medical examiner of Marshall County, said death was the result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Funeral services were conducted at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Grinnell Christian Church, with the Rev. John Epperson officiating. Music was provided by Janice Everts, organist, and Don Thomas and the Arbuckles, a bluegrass band from Shawnee, Okla.

He was married to Marianna Herkey on June 27, 1958, at Kirksville, Mo. Mr. Hulin was a member of the Gilman Fire Department and had served several terms on the Grinnell Town Council. He was a member of B.P.O. Elks Lodge No. 1266 and had also been active in preparing country club courses.
