Schedule Friday Rites Here For Lois Hunter, 58

Mrs. Richard (Lois) Hunter, 58, of 1032 Chatterton Street, died Wednesday noon at a local hospital following an extended illness.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Friday from the Grinnell Methodist church with the pastor, the Rev. Chester E. Custer, officiating. Interment will be in Hazelwood cemetery with James Schalinske Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

The daughter of William E. and Millie Bell Klenden Chedester, she was born June 22nd, 1906, in Taintor, Grant county, Missouri. When she was three her parents moved to a farm near Grinnell where she attended the grade schools and graduated from Grinnell high school.

On Sept. 14th, 1928, at the home of her parents, she was united in marriage with Richard Hunter, who preceded her in death on Jan. 28th, 1963. Following their marriage, they farmed south of Grinnell for a few years and then moved to Grinnell. They had resided in Grinnell since, with the exception of one year during World War II when they lived in Omaha, Neb.

Mrs. Hunter was an active member of the Grinnell Methodist church, a charter member of the A.S.C.S., and past president of that organization, and also was a member of the Literary Club.

She is survived by her son, Floyd of Grinnell; two grandchildren, Perry and Kristin Hunter; a sister, Mrs. Ray (Edith) Foster of Grinnell; two brothers, Brainard E. Chedester of Taintor and Guerdon E. Chedester of Keillogg; and two aunts, Mrs. W. C. French of Grinnell and Mrs. T. H. Renwick of Tracy, Calif.

She was preceded in death by her husband and her parents.
