**Lois Vandivert Hunter,
Former Monte Resident
Buried In San Diego**

Relatives in Montezuma have received word of the death of Lois Vandivert Hunter, 64, in San Diego, Calif., on Nov. 13. She had been a semi-invalid for several years. She attended Montezuma high school in 1910-11, living with her brother-in-law and sister, Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Dickson. Later, when she was a teacher, she spent vacations here with her mother, Mrs. A. H. Vandivert.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Vandivert, Lois Ursula Vandivert was born Jan. 2, 1895, in Bethany, Mo. She attended the University of Iowa and graduated from the Chicago School of Physical Training.

During World War I she served in recreation work. She was a physical education director at the Fort Dodge Y.W.C.A., and Joliet, Ill., public schools after the war.

She married Bernis Hunter, on July 9, 1921, in Montezuma, son of Mr. and Mrs. Steve Hunter, a pharmacist and WWI veteran. In 1930 they moved to San Diego, after living in Davenport and Chicago. A daughter, who died in infancy, is buried in Montezuma.

In 1943 Mrs. Hunter enlisted in the Women's Army Corps. She became a sergeant and served until the end of World War II.

Because of her service in the WAC she received a full military funeral and was buried in Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery, San Diego.

She is survived by her husband, a daughter, Mrs. Mary Fowley, Beverly Hills, Calif., a granddaughter, Gretchen Fowley and grandson, Douglas Fowley, Jr. Relatives in Montezuma are her brother-in-law, C. F. Dickson; nieces Velma and Dorothy Dickson, and Mr. Hunter's niece, Mrs. Lyle Vest.
