## Useful Life Of Mrs. Alec Hunter Ended

Mary McLellan was born near Edinburgh, Scotland, in the year 1858 and died at her home in Grinnell, Iowa, April 10, 1925. In 1890 she came to America where in Davenport, Iowa, she was married to Mr. Alec Hunter. In 1913 they moved to Grinnell, where she has made her home. Early in life she united with the Presbyterian Church in the old country.

Mrs. Hunter was a woman who traveled a great deal and was able to absorb much of what she saw. She had a real practical education and an appreciation of the better things of life. Whenever she went her personal and those of her friends who highly respected her and loved her for her own worth. Her kindly and genial disposition was a great asset to her life. Just to be in her presence, to hear her talk interestingly and intelligently was a delight and an inspiration, while happiness and good cheer seemed to radiate to all.

She had been in fairly good health until she suffered a stroke of paralysis from which she never again recovered. Early Friday morning she slipped away to the great undiscovered land beyond.

Funeral services were conducted Monday morning from the Mellott funeral chapel by Rev. W. J. Todd and the body was taken to Cedar Rapids for burial.
