Former Resident, Edward Hurley Dies In Chicago

Edward B. Hurley, 60, former resident of Grinnell who had made his home in Chicago, Ill., for 30 years, died there Friday after an illness of several years.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Smith Funeral Home with Rev. Chester E. Custer, pastor of the Grinnell Methodist church, officiating. Vocal music was provided by Mrs. Noel Taylor, accompanied by Mrs. Rheo Auman at the organ.

Serving as pallbearers were Floyd LaGrange, Robert Fryman, Warren Parren, Kenneth Ridgway, James Sarver, and Walter Van Ommen. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.

Born in Grinnell on Aug. 31st, 1902, he was the son of David and Anna Stone Hurley. He attended the Grinnell schools and later left here with his family. He had been employed as an accountant in Chicago.

Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Anna Hurley of Chicago; a brother, Frank Raymond Hurley of Des Moines; a niece, Mrs. Robert Fryman of Kansas City, Mo.; and several cousins.

He was preceded in death by his father and one sister, who was accidentally drowned at age 21.
