Veda Hyde rites today

Veda B. Hyde, 79, of 1331 West St., Grinnell, died Monday afternoon, Nov. 30, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 p.m. Thursday at the First Baptist Church, with the Rev. Robert C. Smith officiating. Organist was Edward Bohstedt, and pallbearers were George Christinson, Paul Christinson, Don Fleener, Harold Fleener, Louis Fleener and Arthur Schooley. She was also a member of the Isabella Brand Guild, the Brande Bible Class, Hopeful Barracks Auxiliary of the World War I Veterans, and the F.E.C.U. Club.

Survivors include a daughter, Alice Harter of Des Moines; three grandchildren; three sisters, Vera Christinson and Viola Watkins, both of Grinnell, and Nellie Van Almkerk of Rochester, N.Y.; and one brother, Ralph Fleener of rural Grinnell.
